The Pacific Centre for Peacebuilding (PCP) will be holding a Peace Conference in Suva, Fiji from 18th – 21st September 2016. The Conference will culminate with the Pacific Champion for Peace Award to be awarded on the evening of 21st September, the International Day of Peace.

PCP is calling for papers from individuals, faith based organizations, academics, non-government organisations, civil society organisations, regional and international agencies, government and others, working in the area of Peace in the context of conflict transformation, restorative justice, trauma healing, peace initiatives in community development and in, peace and social justice.

Interest will also be given to papers that look at wider peace initiatives, nationally, regionally or internationally, at current or historical contexts. These can and may include,

- ‘Peace and environment’;
- ‘Peace and religion’;
- ‘Peace, education and multiculturalism’;
- ‘Peace and human security’ and

Interested participants will need to send in an abstract of their paper of no more than 350 words with a title and the main thesis of their paper. Deadline for submissions is **July 18th 2016**
